Education: Ms. Henry earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts at the California College of Arts and Crafts, Oakland, Calif., and a Master of Arts at the Institute of Design, Chicago, where she was a favorite student of László Moholy-Nagy.

Major exhibitions: Ms. Henry's artwork is in numerous collections including the Portland Art Museum, Seattle Art Museum, Tacoma Art Museum, the Institute of Design (Chicago), the Whatcom Museum, Microsoft, Safeco, Amgen, and Hewlett-Packard. She was the focus of a major retrospective in 2007 at the Wright Exhibition Space in Seattle, curated by Matthew Kangas. Her work is represented by Howard House Contemporary Art in Seattle, Aaron Gallery in Chicago, and PDX Contemporary Art in Portland, where her work was recently on exhibit (May 5-May 30, 2009). Her forthcoming exhibition at the Sun Valley Center for the Arts, curated by Courtney Gilbert (Aug. 7-Oct. 2, 2009), will feature her large-scale paintings as well as her delicate constructivist figure drawings from the WPA era.
